War Season

War Season is quickly approaching and now is the time to make sure you are ready for an upcoming summer of fun and war! War season goes hand in hand with camping season, and we should all be going through our gear to make sure we are ready for whatever comes our way.

Fighters, Fencers, Archers – Some light reading material while watching the last of the snow melt from your abodes, now would be a perfect time to re-read rules and regulations on your disciplines. Rules are updated on a regular basis and posted to the east kingdom war pages. The links can be found at http://eastkingdom.org/law-policies.html. It's also a good time to check your personal fighting gear. Make sure the armor is up to spec, no lose bits and pieces, rips or tears, broken shafts, etc. There is nothing worse than anticipating a good weekend or sparring, only to find you have armor failure.

From those out on the field to those of us watching you from the sidelines – we don't know who you are if you don't wear some sort of identification!! A tabard, baldric, your device on your shield, makes it easier for those who are watching to know WHO we are watching! If you don't have personal arms, don't fret; wear your barony, shire, or, dare I say, your Crown Principality Arms!! Yes, have a go at the new arms, or a portion of the arms on your gear! Show that you are proud to be in the crown principality of Tir Mara! Can't decide? A favor on your belt will do nicely as well.

War Banners! War banners are a great way to show your affiliation for a group. There are workshops ongoing, and advice online to help you with the creation of a war banner. Also, War banners flown high on the battlefield prove to be a great rallying point for those in the fight!

Now, after all that fighting, a fighter may need some personal care. Make sure that the first aid kits are equipped with the appropriate bandages, and creams, and ice packs, check expiration dates, and make sure you replace items that are past date. Good things to always include in the pack are band aids, bug spray, sunblock, aloe (for those who forget the sunblock) aspirin, prescription meds, ice packs (either the instant kind, or the kind you put ice in) and a pair of scissors (the kind that will cut heavy canvas or leather straps - just in case.)

Lastly, go through the camping equipment. Check the poles are all intact for tents, ground cloths don't have holes, tents don't have holes, sleeping bags don't have holes, camping tools aren't broken, chairs aren't broken, coolers still function. Make sure the propane tanks are full and not damaged in any way as well. If you have a nylon tent, check the seams; there is a spray you can by to seal the seams, it might get you another years use out of that old tent!

Above all, have fun. This is an escape from real life, enjoy it!



A&S Interests

Daily Life schola – baking in a beehive oven will be the main subject of this day. They also hope to have fleece preparation, spinning, weaving, whipcord braiding, etc. April 16th Bowmans rest.

Remember there are classes being offered at the Middleground event, and at GNEW, as well as an A&S display/competition at both Great Northeastern and Pennsic.

Did You Know?

Hocktide was a medieval festival that may have celebrated the massacre of the Danes in Englaind, or the death of Harthacanute in the 11th century. Traditionally the festivities consisted of a practice called binding. The me of the parish tied up the women and demanded a kiss for their release. The next day the women would tie up the men and demand a payment before setting them free. The monies collected would then be donated to the parish funds. The origins of the name Hocktide however, are unknown.

Hocktide was celebrated on the second Monday or Tuesday after Easter Sunday.

Hock Tuesday was an important term day, rents being then payable, for with Michaelmas it divided the rural year into its winter and summer halves. The term Hock day appears first in the 12th century.

Hocktide celebrations happened over several days with the main day being Tuesday. Tutti men would summon the commoners to the hocktide court in town hall. Those who could not attend were fined 1 penny. The tutti men carried tutti poles, and on top of the poles were cloved oranges. The tutti men were accompanied by the Orange men, who wore a hat decorated with feathers and carried sacks filled with oranges. Tutti wenches would give out the oranges and sweets to the crowd in exchange for pennies, or kisses.
